DEFINITION OF PROCESS EQUIPMENT

PROCESS EQUIPMENT: Primary examples of process equipment are agitators, mixers, the many types of crushing, grinding and screen equipment, vacuum and pressure filters, centrifuges, furnaces, kilns, dryers, sedimentation and classification devices. Included are all the principal equipment required for water conditioning, treatment of industrial and municipal wastes, metallurgical processing, pulp and paper production, food processing, production of petrochemicals and many other similar processing operations.

During the member applicant review process, open-ended consideration is given to the manufacturer roles controlled and filled by the corporate entity applying for membership: Sell, assemble, transfer title/liability, provide after-sales service, stock parts, test, design systems, engineer applications, and specify standards. Of these functions controlled by the entity, not all of the aforementioned roles need to be performed in-house.

SCHEDULE OF 2010 PEMA® ANNUAL DUES

Dues are based on the profit center for North America, that is, the facility where process equipment orders were taken and executed in the previous year, including orders entered for spare parts, repair parts and export orders.
